Methodist mission volunteers in a rewarding ministry of cheerful service

- Who:** Mostly retired couples/singles who travel in their personal RV's.
- What:** Construction, remodeling, maintenance, painting, electrical, plumbing, cooking, office work, yard work, clothes closet staffing, food banks...you name it.
- Where:** Arizona, Southern California, South Texas and Florida during the winter...and from Washington and Alaska to Maine and many points in between during the spring, summer and fall, assisting Methodist organizations - churches, children's homes and camping institutions.
- How:** Our typical three-week projects involve 24 hours of work per person each week, daily devotions, and ongoing fun. Disaster Rebuilding projects may extend for many months, with NOMADS working anywhere from one week to months at a time.
- Why:** To share the power of God with those in need.

### **2022 Statistics for the Methodist NOMADS**

- 3-week Projects:** 141 projects in 37 states
- Disaster Rebuilding:** 4,564 hours for long term efforts in Laurel, Mississippi, plus Lake Charles and Grand Isle, Louisiana.
- Drop-in work:** 25+ agencies helped, with 3252+ hours donated
- Members:** 821 members and 198 Alumni members who reside in 45 states, plus Canada.
- Hours:** 86,140 hours donated this year in total.
- Labor Value:** Over \$2.45 million this year, at \$28.54 per volunteer hour, and more than \$25 million in the past 10 years!!
